Partnership exists between Fairfield MOW & Campbelltown MOW. Comments:

Campbelltown Meals on Wheels Inc. have almost doubled the number of clients from CALD backgrounds since the project began as word has begun to filter through the CALD networks that a range of meals are now available.

WSACCI Meals on Wheels: CALD clients have increased almost fivefold, as residents from the local Estonian Village are now receiving meals.

Camden MOW: While the number of CALD clients have remained static, there has been a 40% increase in the number of meals delivered on Fridays (the day CALD and other WFS meals are distributed to clients)

Wingecarribee Food Services have added approximately 10 CALD meals & desserts to their menu. These meals have been well received by all clients.
